Simple Present Tense

Positive Sentence (Subject + V1)

She puts the keys on the table.

Negative Sentence (Subject + do/does not + V1)

She does not put the keys on the table.



Simple Present Tense

Interrogative Sentence
(Do/ Does + Subject + V1)

Does she put the keys on the table?



Present Progressive Tense

Positive Sentence (sub + be (is/am/are/was/were) + v-ing)

I am playing football.

Negative Sentence (sub + be + not + v- ing)

I am not playing football.



Present Progressive

Interrogative Sentence (be + sub + v - ing)

Am I playing football?



Present Perfect Tense
Positive Sentence
(subject + have/ has + v3)
I have already prepared the breakfast.

Negative Sentence
(subject + have/has + not + v3)
I have not prepared the breakfast yet.

Interrogative Sentence
(have/has + subject + v3)
Have you prepared the breakfast?

Present Perfect Continuous Tense
Positive Sentence
(subject + have/ has + been +v-ing)
Ramesh has been repairing the car.

Negative Sentence (subject + have/ has + not + been + v -ing)

Ramesh has not been repairing the car.

Interrogative Sentence (has/have +sub + been +v-ing) Has Ramesh been repairing the car?

Simple Past Tense Positive Sentence (subject + v2)We watched the news last night. Negative Sentence (subject + did not + v1)We did not watch the news last night. **Interrogative Sentence** (Did + sub + v1)Did we watch the news last night?



Past Progressive Tense
Positive Sentence
(subject + be (was/were) + v-ing)
They were studying English yesterday.
Negative Sentence
(subject + be (was/were) + not + v-ing)
You were not studying English
yesterday.



Past Progressive Interrogative Sentence

(be (was/were) + subject + v - ing)
Were they studying Mathematics
yesterday?



Past Perfect

Positive sentence (subject + had + v3)
She had come late to the school.

Negative sentence (subject + had + not + v3) I had not completed the task.



Past Perfect
Interrogative sentence
(had + subject + v3)
Had you completed the task?

Past Perfect Continuous Tense.

Positive Sentence

(subject + had + been + v- ing)

When her husband came home, the woman had been cleaning the house for hours.

Past Perfect Continuous Tense Negative Sentence (subject + had + not + been + v - ing)She had not been working all day. So she was energetic.) **Interrogative sentence** (had + subject + been + v - ing)Had they been running for several minutes when the teacher came?



Future Simple
Positive Sentence
(subject + will/shall + v1)
I will compose the poem.
Negative Sentence
(subject + will/shall + not (won't) + v1)

I won't compose the poem.



Future Simple

Interrogative Sentence (shall/will + subject + v1)) Will I compose the poem?



Future Progressive
Positive Sentence
(subject + shall/ will + be + v - ing)
I will be studying in class X.
Negative Sentence
(subject + shall/will + not + be + v-ing)
I won't be studying in class X.



Future Progressive

Interrogative Sentence (shall/will + subject + be + v- ing)

Will I be studying in class X?



Future Perfect
Positive Sentence
(subject + shall/ will + have+v3)
I will have completed the task.

Negative Sentence (subject + shall/ will + not + have + v3) I won't have completed the work.



Future Perfect

Interrogative Sentence (shall/ will +subject + have+v3)

Will I have completed the task?



Future Perfect Continuous Positive Sentence (subject + shall/ will +have + been + v-ing) I will have been residing in this room for ten years. **Negative Sentence** (subject + shall/will + not + have /has + been + v - ing)I won't have been residing in this room for ten years.

Future Perfect Continuous

Interrogative Sentence (shall/will + subject + have + been + v -ing)

Will I have been residing in this house for 10 years?
