The *Kuppia* garment is similar to *Kuffia*- the Arab garment. That is why, it is said that may be their ancestors were Arabs or Kurds.

Bravery and Hospitality:

The people are very welcoming and warm in nature. They are hospitable and they feel very proud to talk about the tales of their forefathers' bravery. They are always ready to entertain with stories of their ancestors. The people of Coorg are known to be one of the bravest.
