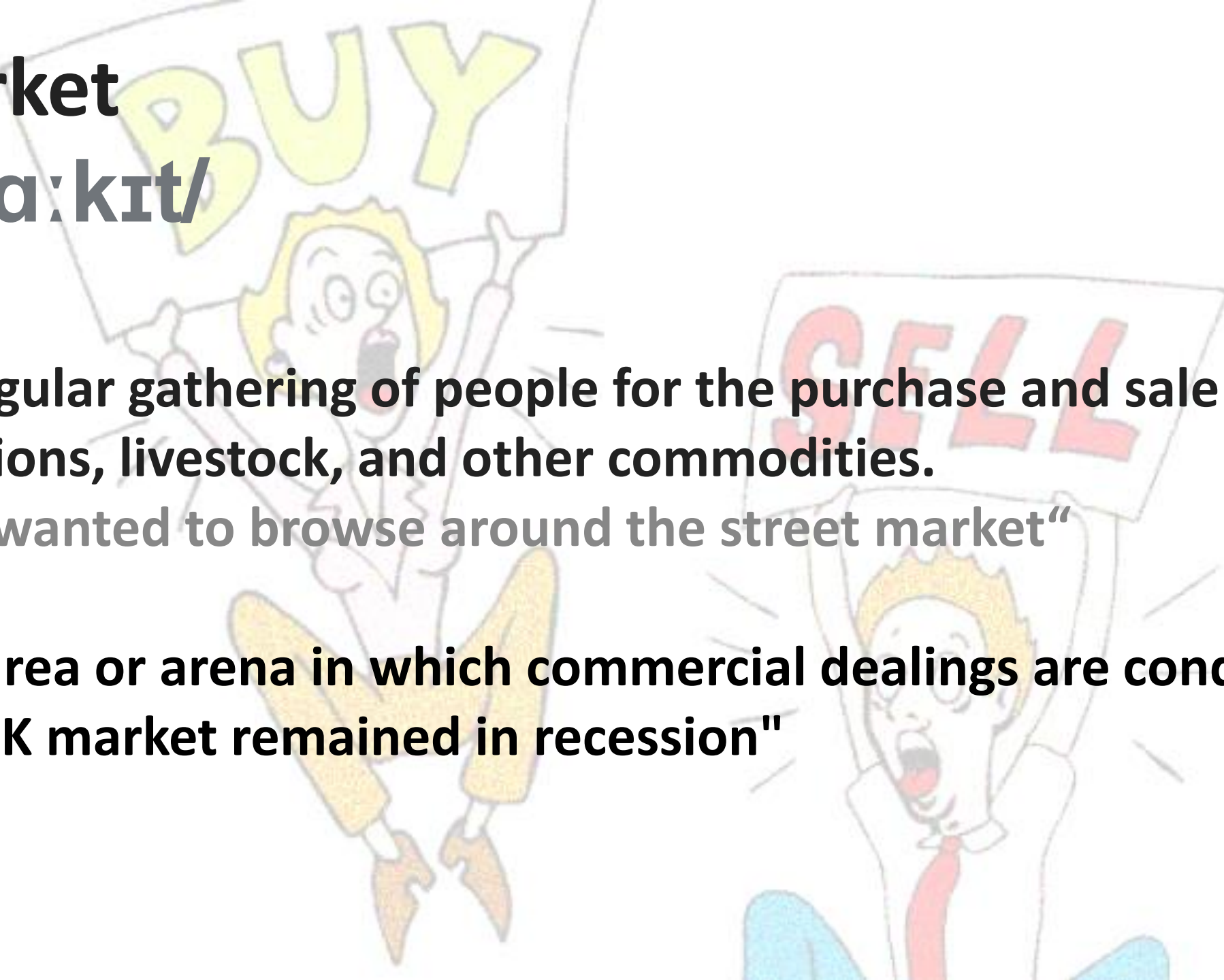
noun

Neighbourhood Shops: These are shops which sell goods and services in our neighbourhoods. easily accessible, they cater to our daily needs.

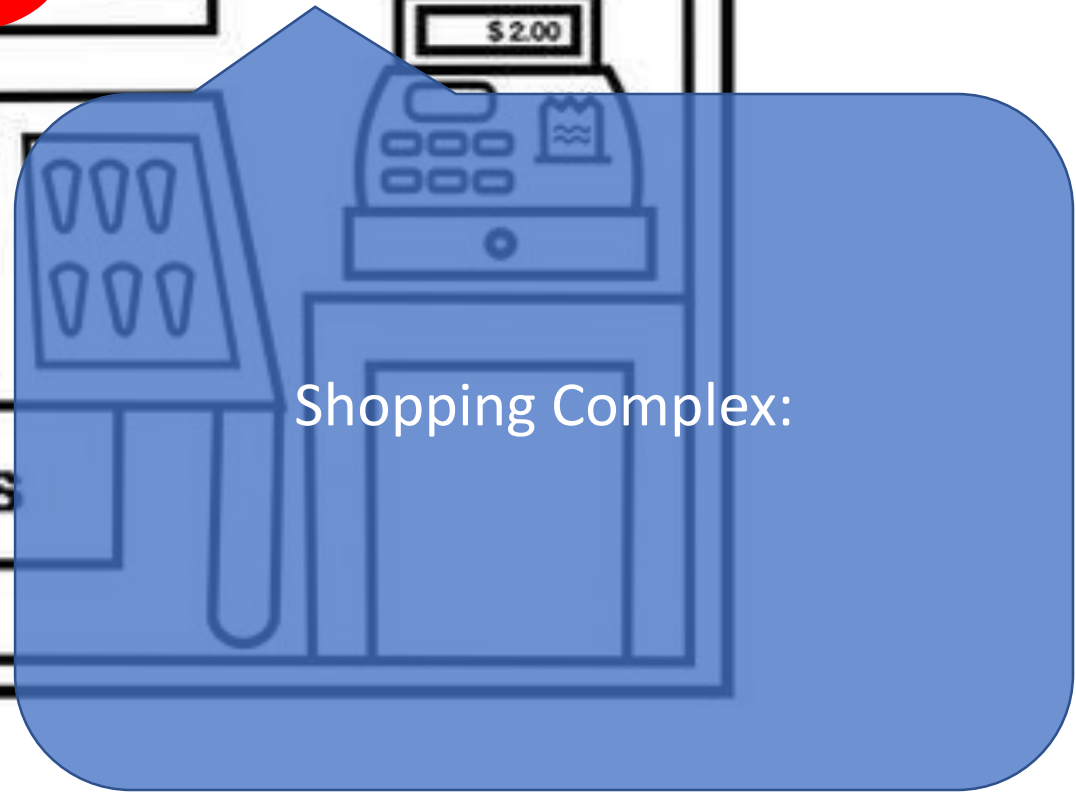




Malls-
